

**NOTICE OF MODIFICATION ORDER**  
**SECTION 53 OF THE WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**  
**THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF DURHAM REVISED MAP IN DEFINITIVE MAP**  
**FORM (3<sup>RD</sup> REVIEW) PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY (1967) DEFINITIVE MAP**  
**AND STATEMENT**  
**THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF GATESHEAD FOOTPATH 100 BLAYDON**  
**DEFINITIVE MAP MODIFICATION ORDER 2010**

The above order, made on 26 May 2010, if confirmed as made, will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding to them the footpath from Point A (NGR NZ13795952), on Bute Road North adjacent to the entrance into the allotment gardens, running beside the North View bungalows for approximately 16 metres in a southerly direction, at a width of 2 metres, to Point B. From Point B, following the footpath between the houses and the gardens for approximately 25 metres in a southerly direction, and then for approximately 95 metres in a south-westerly direction, at a width of 1.8 metres, to Point C. From Point C, for approximately 12 metres in a south-easterly direction, at a width of 2 metres to join North View at Point D (NGR NZ13725941), as indicated on the attached map.

Any representation or objection relating to the order must be sent in writing to the Strategic Director of Corporate Services and Governance at the above address **not later than 30 June 2023** and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made, quoting reference TS/511 on all correspondence.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Borough Council of Gateshead, instead of submitting the order to the Secretary of State may itself confirm the order. If the order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
