

THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF GATESHEAD HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
SECTION 90C (SWALLOW TAIL DRIVE, LOBLEY HILL)
PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION OF ROAD HUMPS 2024

NOTICE is hereby given that the Borough Council of Gateshead in exercise of its powers under Section 90A of the Highways Act 1980 and after consultation and in accordance with Section 90C of the Highways Act 1980 proposes to construct a road hump complying with the Highways (Road Humps) Regulations 1999 as a traffic calming measure in order to regulate vehicle speed and improve road safety for all road users in the immediate vicinity.

The proposal consists of the introduction of one flat top speed table at the junction of Swallow Tail Drive and Lobley Hill Road, Lobley Hill with a height of 100mm, full width of the carriageway – Swallow Tail Drive– from its junction with Lobley Hill Road in a westerly direction for a distance of 8 metres.

The current speed limit on the road is 30mph. There are no additional works or traffic calming features to be undertaken. Signs will be erected and road markings provided in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 at all appropriate locations.
