**THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF GATESHEAD
(DURHAM ROAD QTC PHASE 4 PART 2 GATESHEAD) TRAFFIC REGULATION
ORDER 2016**

The Borough Council of Gateshead ("hereinafter referred to as the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 32 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), by virtue of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Northumbria Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

**PART I
General**

Interpretation

1. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"civil enforcement officer" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council under Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 to supervise and enforce the road traffic contraventions for which the Council is the enforcement authority;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's parking disc" means a disc issued by a local authority (125 millimetres square) coloured blue if issued on or after 1st April 2000 or orange if issued before that date and is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun;

"exemption certificate" means an authorisation in writing granted by the Service Director, Transport Strategy of the Council or their duly authorised representative allowing a vehicle to wait in contravention of the provisions of this Order subject to and in accordance with any specified conditions or limitations contained within that authorisation;

"goods vehicle" means a vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods of any description and is not drawing a trailer;

"parking bay" means any area within a parking place which is provided for the leaving of vehicles and is indicated by road markings compliant with The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"parking place" means a place on a length of road designated under Part V Articles 1 and 2 and Part VI Article 1 and Part VII Article 1 which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and is indicated by road markings compliant with The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"penalty charge" means a charge set by the Council in accordance with the provisions of Section 77 and Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and

Regulations made thereunder and in accordance with any guidance given by the Secretary of State;

“penalty charge notice” means a notice issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions of Section 78 Traffic Management Act 2004 and Regulations made thereunder;

“postal operator” means a person who provides the service of conveying postal packets from one place to another by post or any of the related services of receiving, collecting, sorting and delivering of such packets as defined in section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000;

“postal service” means the service of conveying postal packets from one place to another by post and the related services of receiving, collecting and delivering of such packets and any other service which relates to any of those services and is provided in conjunction with any of them as defined in section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000;

“relevant position” means-

- (a) the disabled person's parking disc, disabled person's badge or exemption certificate is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle; or
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia, the disabled person's parking disc, disabled person's badge or exemption certificate is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front of the disabled person's parking disc, disabled person's badge or exemption certificate is clearly legible from outside of the vehicle;

“traffic sign” means a sign of any size, colour or type prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under Section 64 of the Act;

“vehicle” means any motor car, motor cycle and Invalid Carriage having the same meaning respectively as in Section 136 of the Act and any goods vehicle (being a motor vehicle not exceeding 30 unit unladen weight which is constructed or adapted for use for carriage of goods of any description).

PART II

Revocations

1. The Orders set out in Part I of Schedule 8 to this Order are hereby revoked to the extent as indicated in that of the Schedule.
2. The Orders set out in Part II of Schedule 8 to this Order are hereby revoked in their entirety.

PART III

Waiting Restrictions

No Waiting at Any Time

1. Save as provided in Part III Article 4 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in or on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.

No Waiting between the hours of 7.30am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday (inclusive)

2. Save as provided in Part III Article 4 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 7.30am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday (inclusive) in or on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.

No Waiting between the hours of 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday (Inclusive)

3. Save as provided in Part III Article 4 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday (inclusive) in or on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order.

Exemptions

4. (1) Nothing in Part III Articles 1, 2 or 3 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in or on the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) the picking up or setting down of passengers;
 - (b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely-
 - (i) building or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or on land adjacent to the said length of road of any sewer, main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

- (d) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
- (e) to enable a vehicle to be used by a postal operator in provision of a postal service;
- (f) any police, fire brigade or ambulance vehicle on emergency call or being used for such purposes;
- (g) any vehicle used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (h) a vehicle waiting on a parking place duly authorised by an Order made under the 1984 Act provided that the vehicle is parked in accordance with the provisions of such an Order;
- (i) any vehicle displaying a valid exemption certificate in the relevant position.

(2) Nothing in Part III Articles 1, 2 or 3 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge and disabled persons parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day).

PART IV

On Street Limited Waiting Bays

1. The lengths of road specified in Column 1 to Schedule 4 to this Order are hereby designated as a parking place for all vehicles under section 32 of the Act, subject to the provisions in this Order, operating Monday to Saturday (inclusive) during the hours of 8am to 6pm for a longer period than 1 hour if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the termination, during the said hours, of the last period of waiting by that vehicle on the same length of road, as specified in Columns 3 and 4 of that Schedule.
2. Save as provided in Part IV Article 1 to this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a civil enforcement officer cause or permit a vehicle to wait between the hours of 8am to 6pm Monday to Saturday (inclusive) in or on lengths of road specified in Schedule 4 to this Order for a longer period than 1 hour; if a period of less than two hours has elapsed since the termination, during the said hours, of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle on the same length of road.
3. The lengths of road specified in Column 1 to Schedule 5 to this Order are hereby designated as a parking place for all vehicles under section 32 of the Act, subject to the provisions in this Order, operating Monday to Saturday (inclusive) during the hours of 8am to 4pm for a longer period than 1 hour if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the termination, during the said hours, of the last period of waiting by

that vehicle on the same length of road, as specified in Columns 3 and 4 of that Schedule.

4. Save as provided in Part IV Article 3 to this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a civil enforcement officer cause or permit a vehicle to wait between the hours of 8am to 4pm Monday to Saturday (inclusive) in or on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 5 to this Order for a longer period than 1 hour if a period of less than two hours has elapsed since the termination, during the said hours, of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle on the same length of road.
5. Every vehicle left in a parking place shall stand so that the vehicle is wholly within the parking place or if the parking place is so marked within any parking bay.
6. A civil enforcement officer as authorised by the Service Director, Transport Strategy may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension is reasonably necessary, in connection with, building and highway maintenance works, vans for the removal of furniture, hearses in connection with funerals, or any other reason deemed reasonably necessary by the Council.
7. A police officer in uniform may suspend for not longer than 24 hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider that such suspension is reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
8. Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Part IV Articles 6 and 7 to this Order, shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to the parking place or part thereof the use of which is suspended a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
9. For so long as a traffic sign prohibiting waiting is displayed in accordance with Part IV Article 8 to this Order, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in that parking place or part thereof PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait if the vehicle is left with the permission of the person suspending the parking place or part thereof.
10. A police officer in uniform may in the case of an emergency move or cause to be moved vehicles left in a parking place to any place they think fit.
11. A civil enforcement officer may if they deem it appropriate and in accordance with the Council's Enforcement Policy, move or cause to be moved vehicles left in a parking place to another position on that road or to another road or to a place which is not on a road, as they deem appropriate.
12. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of Part IV Articles 10 and 11 to this Order, may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as they may think necessary to enable them to remove it or alter its position as the case may be.
13. When a person removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from the parking place they shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

14. Nothing in Part IV Articles 1, 2, 3 and 4 to this Order, shall apply to a vehicle being used by the emergency service vehicles whilst they are on duty and attending an emergency call.
15. Nothing in Part IV Articles 1, 2, 3 and 4 to this Order, shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait or park in or on a parking place, for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (a) Picking up and setting down of passengers;
 - (b) For goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely-
 - (i) building or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or on land adjacent to the said length of road of any sewer, main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (v) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
 - (vi) to enable a vehicle to be used by a postal operator in provision of a postal service;
 - (vii) any vehicle used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (viii) any vehicle displaying a valid exemption certificate in the relevant position.
 - (ix) any vehicle being used or appropriated for use for naval, military or airforce purposes as indicated (where applicable) on the identification plate on the vehicle or any vehicle belonging to any visiting forces (within the meaning of the Visiting Forces Act 1952).

PART V

Goods Vehicle Only Loading Bay operating from 7.00am to 8.00am and 4.00pm to 5.00pm on Monday to Saturday (Inclusive)

1. The lengths of roads described in Schedule 6 to this Order are hereby designated as a parking place under section 32 of the Act, subject to the provisions in this Order, for use by goods vehicles only, operating from 7.00am to 8.00am and 4.00pm to 5.00pm on Monday to Saturday (inclusive).

2. Save as provided in Part V Article 13 to this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle other than a goods vehicle to wait for the purposes of loading or unloading only between the hours of 7.00am to 8.00am and 4.00pm to 5.00pm on Monday to Saturday (inclusive) in or on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 6 to this Order.
3. Every vehicle left in a parking place shall stand so that the vehicle is wholly within the parking place or if the parking place is so marked within any parking bay.
4. A civil enforcement officer as authorised by the Service Director, Transport Strategy may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension is reasonably necessary, in connection with, building and highway maintenance works, vans for the removal of furniture, hearses in connection with funerals, or any other reason deemed reasonably necessary by the Council.
5. A police officer in uniform may suspend for not longer than 24 hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider that such suspension is reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
6. Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Part V Articles 3 and 4 to this Order, shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to the parking place or part thereof the use of which is suspended a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
7. For so long as a traffic sign prohibiting waiting is displayed in accordance with Part V Article 6 to this Order, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in that parking place or part thereof PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait if the vehicle is left with the permission of the person suspending the parking place or part thereof.
8. A police officer in uniform may in the case of an emergency move or cause to be moved vehicles left in a parking place to any place they think fit.
9. A civil enforcement officer may if they deem it appropriate and in accordance with the Council's Enforcement Policy, move or cause to be moved vehicles left in a parking place to another position on that road or to another road or to a place which is not on a road, as they deem appropriate.
10. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of Part V Articles 8 and 9 to this Order, may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as they may think necessary to enable them to remove it or alter its position as the case may be.
11. When a person removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from the parking place they shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
12. Nothing in Part V Articles 1 and 2 to this Order, shall apply to a vehicle being used by the emergency service vehicles whilst they are on duty and attending an emergency call.

13. Nothing in Part V Articles 1 and 2 to this Order, shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait or park in or on a parking place, for so long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) Picking up and setting down of passengers;
- (b) For goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or on land adjacent to the said length of road of any sewer, main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (v) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
 - (vi) to enable a vehicle to be used by a postal operator in provision of a postal service;
 - (vii) any vehicle used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (viii) any vehicle displaying a valid exemption certificate in the relevant position.
 - (ix) any vehicle being used or appropriated for use for naval, military or airforce purposes as indicated (where applicable) on the identification plate on the vehicle or any vehicle belonging to any visiting forces (within the meaning of the Visiting Forces Act 1952).

PART VI

Disabled Person's Badge Parking Places

1. (i) The lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of Schedule 7 to this Order are hereby designated as a parking place under section 32 of the Act, subject to the provisions in this Order, for vehicles displaying in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge, on such days and during such hours as may be specified in Columns 3 and 4 of that Schedule.

- (ii) The limits of the parking place shall be indicated by the Council on the carriageway by the appropriate traffic signs and the maximum number of parking bays within each parking place shall be as specified in Column 2 of Schedule 7.
2. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle other than a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge to wait in or on a parking place specified in column 1 of Schedule 7 to this Order.
 3. Every vehicle left in a parking place, specified in Column 1 of Schedule 7 to this Order shall:
 - (i) so stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within a parking place or if the parking place is so marked with parking bays, and
 - (ii) display the disabled person's badge in the relevant position and that badge remains on display during the whole period the vehicle is left to stand in the parking place or bay
 4. Nothing in Part VI Article 1 to this Order shall restrict the power of the Council to close or suspend the parking place or any part thereof.
 5. A police officer in uniform may suspend for not longer than twenty four hours the use of the parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension is reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
 6. Any person suspending the use of the parking place or any part thereof in accordance with Part VI Articles 4 and 5, shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to the parking place or part thereof the use of which is suspended, a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
 7. For so long as a traffic sign prohibiting waiting in the parking place is displayed in accordance with Part VI Article 6 to this Order, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in that parking place or part thereof PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait if the vehicle is left with the permission of the person suspending the parking place or part thereof in pursuance of Part VI Articles 4 and 5 to this Order, or with the permission of a police officer in uniform.

PART VII

Amendments to the Borough Council of Gateshead (Prohibition of Stopping and Waiting, Except Taxis) Order 2007

1. Amendments to the Borough Council of Gateshead (Prohibition of Stopping and Waiting, Except Taxis) Order 2007 is amended as follows:
2. In Schedule 2 Part 1 'No Stopping or Waiting At Any Time – Except Taxis', Item 3 relating to 'Durham Road, Low Fell', is hereby revoked in its entirety.

3. In Schedule 2 Part V 'No Waiting 6pm to 8am – Except for Taxis', after Item 1 relating to 'High Street Gateshead', insert the new Item 2 below:

"2. Durham Road, Low Fell - west side from a point 17.5 metres north of its junction with Cross Keys Lane in a northerly direction for 25 metres."

PART VIII

Amendments to the Borough Council of Gateshead (Traffic Movements) (Consolidation) Order 2010

1. Amendments to the Borough Council of Gateshead (Traffic Movements) (Consolidation) Order 2010 is amended as follows:
2. In Schedule 5.01 'No Right Turn', after Item 43 relating to 'A184 Askew Road', insert the following new Items 44 and 45 below:

44.	Denewell Avenue	Into Durham Road, Low Fell

PART IX

Amendments to the Borough Council of Gateshead (Bus Lanes) Traffic Regulation Order 2014

1. Amendments to the Borough Council of Gateshead (Bus Lanes) Traffic Regulation Order 2014 is amended as follows:
2. In Part I Article 1 'Definitions' after the Item relating to 'Universal Service Provider', insert the new definition below:

"Hackney Carriage" has the same meaning as defined in section 37 of the Town and Police Clauses Act 1847".

3. In Part II 'Bus Lanes', after Article 3 insert the following new Articles 4 and 5 below:

"4. Save as provided in Part V Article 1 a vehicle other than a Bus and Pedal Cycle must not be in a Bus Lane specified in columns 1 and 2 of Schedule 7 to this Order at any time.

5. Save as provided in Part V Article 1 a vehicle other than a Bus, Pedal Cycle and Hackney Carriage must not be in a Bus Lane specified in columns 1 and 2 of Schedule 8 to this Order at any time."

4. After Schedule 6 relating to 'Bus Only Street (Bus Only)', insert the following new Schedule 7 and Schedule 8 below:

"SCHEDULE 7

BUS LANE (BUS AND PEDAL CYCLE ONLY)

ITEM NO.	COLUMN 1 – NAME OF ROAD	COLUMN 2 – LENGTH OF ROAD
1.	Durham Road, Low Fell	That length of the western part of the carriageway of that highway, which extends from a point 67 metres south of its junction with Enfield Road in a southerly direction for 283 metres.

SCHEDULE 8

BUS LANE (BUS, PEDAL CYCLE AND HACKNEY CARRIAGE)

ITEM NO.	COLUMN 1 – NAME OF ROAD	COLUMN 2 – LENGTH OF ROAD
1.	Durham Road, Low Fell	That length of the western part of the carriageway which extends from a point 53 metres north of its junction with Cross Keys Lane in a northerly direction for 34 metres.
2.	Durham Road, Low Fell	That length of the eastern part of the carriageway of that highway which extends from a point 50 metres south of Musgrave Road in a southerly direction for 420 metres.

PART X

Contraventions

- 1 (1) If a vehicle is left in contravention of an Article of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable.
- (2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable, a penalty charge notice may then be issued by a civil enforcement officer or the Council in accordance with the requirements of Section 78 of the 2004 Act.


PART XI

Savings and Commencement

1. (1) The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act, or by or under any other enactment.
- (2) In so far as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act, or by or under any other enactment, THEN the provisions of THIS ORDER shall prevail.
2. This Order shall come into operation on the 25th day of April 2016 and may be cited as The Borough Council of Gateshead (Durham Road QTC Phase 4 Part 2 Gateshead) Traffic Regulation Order 2016.

1. Albert Drive	(i)North side	(a) From its junction with Durham Road in a westerly direction to its junction with Coleridge Avenue.
	(ii)South side	(a) From its junction with Durham Road in a westerly direction for 35 metres.
	(iii)South east side	(a) From a point 23 metres southwest of its junction with Well Lane in a south-westerly direction for 22.5 metres.
	(iv)West side	(a) From its junction with Coleridge Avenue in a south-westerly direction for 8.5 metres.
2. Alum Well Road	(i)North west side	(a) From its junction with Cross Keys Lane in a south westerly direction for 6 metres.
	(i)South east side	(a) From its junction with Cross Keys Lane in a south westerly direction for 10 metres.
3. Beaconsfield Road	(i)North side	(a) From its junction with Durham Road in a north-easterly direction to its junction with Kells Lane.
4. Beaconsfield Road	(i)South side	(a) From a point 5 metres east of its junction with Durham Road in an easterly direction to a point 9 metres east of its junction with Clement Street.
5. Belle Vue Bank	(i)North side	(a) From a point 7.5 metres west of its junction with Durham Road in a westerly direction for 154.5 metres.

6. Belle Vue Bank	(i)South side	(a) From its junction with Durham Road in a westerly direction for 100 metres.
7. Belle Vue Bank	(i)South east side	(a) From a point 15 metres west of Cross Keys Lane to a point 15 metres east of that junction.
