BOROUGH OF GATESHEAD STROTHERS ROAD, HIGH SPEN
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1982

The Borough Council of Gateshead pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Tyne and Wear in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1)(2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967 hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the *22nd* day of *FEBRUARY* 1982 and may be cited as The Borough of Gateshead Strotthers Road High Spen (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1982
2. In this Order:-
 - "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975
 - "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975
 - "disabled person's parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs (BA No. 4631: 1970) but coloured orange and capable of showing the quarter hours period during which a period of waiting begins: and -
 - "relevant position" means -
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the disabled person's badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and
 - (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the disabled person's badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle
3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length and on the side of road specified in the Schedule to this Order
4. i) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the length of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle

- (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose on any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
- i) building, or demolition operations
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said side of the road
 - iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or in land adjacent to the said length of road or of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878
- (c) the vehicle if it cannot be conveniently used for such purpose on any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties
- (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953; or
- (e) the vehicle to take in petrol oil water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road
- ii) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order
- iii) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a disabled person's parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which Article 3 for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of the road on the same day)
5. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1967 or by or under any other enactment

SCHEDULE

<u>Name of Road</u>	<u>Description of Restriction</u>
Strothers Road, High Spen	Both sides of the road from its junction with Ramsey Street for a distance of 30 metres in a westerly direction.
