(ACCESS ROAD TO PARKFIELD ESTATE RYTON)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1991

The Borough Council of Gateshead ("the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) & 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

Part I
General

Interpretation

- 1 In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-
 - "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982
 - "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) England and Wales) Regulations 1986
 - "disabled person's parking disc" means a disc issued by a local authority complying with the requirements of the British Standards Specifications for Parking Discs (BS No 4631 : 1970) but coloured orange and capable of showing the quarter hours period during which a period of waiting begins: and - "relevant position" means -
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the disabled person's badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and
 - (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the disabled person's badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.

Part II
Waiting Restrictions

Prohibition of Waiting at Any Time

- 2 Save as provided in Article 3 and 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on both sides of the access road to Parkfield Estate from Main Road Ryton, for a distance of 12 metres.

- 3 (1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (a) the picking up and setting down of passengers;
 - (b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) Building or demolition operations
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the said roads;
 - (iv) the laying erection alteration or maintenance in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer, main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
 - (d) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953.
- (2) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle being used for Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance purposes.
- 4 Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a disabled person's parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of road referred to therein for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day).
- 5 The restrictions and prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment
- 6 This Order shall come into operation on 17 February 1991 and may be cited as the Borough Council of Gateshead (Access Road to Parkfield Estate Ryton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1991.
